BISHOP HOGAN NEWS

Our 8th graders and their chaperones returned last Saturday from the trip to Washington, D.C. and the March for Life. It was a great experience and very impactful! A feeling of renewed hope and excitement permeated the rally, held before the march. The line-up of speakers was amazing, some of whom were Vice-President J.D. Vance, Speaker of the House Mike Johnson, Governor Ron DeSantis (Florida), President of the Student Pro-Life Organization, Bethany Hamilton, and others President Trump spoke on a pre-recorded video. There were thousands of marchers, mostly young people, carrying signs, holding banners, saying the rosary, chanting, singing, or quietly marching. They were all marching to be the 'voice' for the unborn.

According to EWTN, Archbishop Joseph Naumann of Kansas City, Kansas, who offered a prayer at the beginning of the rally, told CNA in the midst of the March that he believes this year "there is a renewed hope." "This is probably my 35th, 36th march," he said, adding that he continues to attend each year "because it's the most important human rights issue of our time." The archbishop emphasized that even though Roe v. Wade has been overturned, the prolife movement still has work to do".
